Active Executive Secretaries Of Rationing Boards Named

Charles Lehmkohl is Named Chairman for Hawthorne

Joseph N. J. August 27-In a letter to all chairmen of War Price and Rationing Boards, James Kenney, Jr., State Director of the Office of Price Administration, today designated one employee in each board as Acting Executive Secretary. Kenney's letter said: "You understand that this appointment is only temporary in order that we may function in the utmost possible manner until I can, under the expanded program, receive a nomination from you for the position."

Enclosed with Kenney's letter was a copy of a Field Administrative Letter in which the War Price and Rationing Board outlined the duties of the Executive Secretary, and which indicated jurisdiction and functional responsibilities among local board personnel. Also enclosed was an appendix listing each county's appointed and acting Executive Secretaries.

The administrative letter explained that the Executive Secretary would act as chief administrative officer and office manager for the board, under the supervision of the board. It outlined the following duties for which the secretary is responsible to the chairman:

1. The organization and maintenance of the board's office staff.
2. The maintenance of all board files and records, in accordance with OPA regulations and instructions.
3. The preparation of all reports required by OPA regulations and instructions.
4. The manner in which members of the public are received.

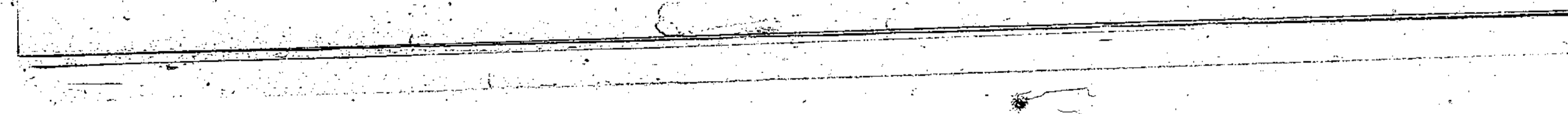
