AVOID HITCH-HIKERS COURT RECOMMENDS

"Accommodating hitch-hikers is a source of danger to life, limb and property."

Such is the finding of the New Jersey Supreme Court in a recent decision denying the application of a widow for workmen's compensation for the death of her husband traveling salesman who was killed by a hitch-hiker he had befriended.

The court said:

"The pick-up is purely a charitable incident for the accommodation of the hitch-hiker. It was entirely outside the employment itself and benefited the employer neither directly or indirectly. The granting of rides to unknown people seeking them for unknown reasons is not a risk of the highway but a self-imposed risk brought about by the motorist himself. It is common knowledge that accommodating hitch-hikers is a source of danger to life, limb and property."

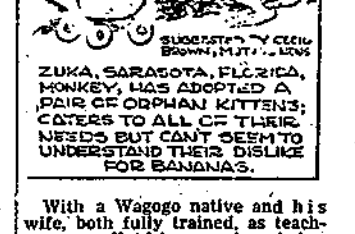

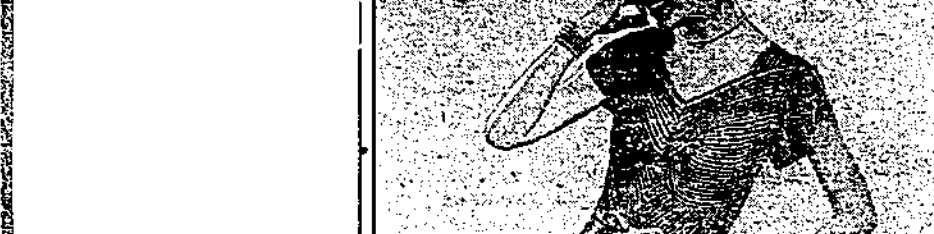

JERSEY CITIZENS AND THE HOOPER REPORT

The greatest mass movement in the history of American citizens striving for better government is now underway.

Through the National Citizens Committee for the Hoover Report, Americans in every walk of life are now vigorously supporting the points which would save the nation's taxpayers three to five billion annually and provide more efficient government.

This movement has already demonstrated its strength. As the New Jersey Taxpayers' Association pointed out recently, initial action by Congress on the Hoover Commission recommendations came only after the national citizens organization was formed. Therefore, the Association says, the issue is clear. Support from "back home" must continue, if the great benefits contemplated in the Hoover Report are to be realized.

New Jersey taxpayers' share of the estimated \$5 billion savings proposed would be \$161 million, or about the amount of the present State budget.

The recently formed New Jersey Citizens for the Hoover Report, affiliated with the National Citizens Committee, links the New Jersey citizen with the national movement through which this saving can be obtained.

How can the individual citizen help?

First, he must learn everything he can about the Hoover Report, then speak "out" to his Congressmen and Senators, telling them he wants its recommendations acted upon and the vast potential savings realized.

Second, he must stand ready to join with other citizens in his community to support the activities of the State and national organizations, through which the desire for greater efficiency and economy can be expressed effectively.

As Robert L. Johnson, president of Temple University and chairman of National Citizens Committee for the Hoover Report, points out: "We face now an opportunity, which may well be the last of our kind."
