What Is Welfare?

Throughout the years since the very beginning of the exploration of the New World, this has been the land of opportunity. Early history is filled with early explorers' tales of streets paved with gold and the wealth that would reward any daring adventurer willing to migrate to the virgin land.

Over the decades since, millions of people have followed the ocean paths in search of the fulfillment of the promised dream. Some have made it, more in fact than ever before in the history of man. Others have not.

The American is, despite many shortcomings, a genous individual. He has learned that he has an unwritten obligation to his neighbor to help when needed. If another man is unable to care for himself why shouldn't he share in the abundance? If a man is unable temporarily to provide for his family's needs others will help him with the necessities until he is able to return to the work force. This is as it should be, We are a capitalist society. Each of us profits by the labor of others. What one produces another consumes. What is consumed is paid for with earnings received for productivity. The more men employed, the larger the market. Aid to the incapacitated is welfare. It is not demeaning. It is our way of proving to the world that we take care of our own. Aid to the temporarily unemployed is welfare. It, too, is not of itself degrading but a way of showing confidence in our system. It is an investment in the recipient's future, and should provide enough to prevent hunger or misery, mithout encouraging permanent unemployment.

When welfare provides a means of remaining unemployed, the time has come for Americans to have a care ful look at exactly how much welfare can be dispensed without threatening their future.







The town has supplied buses for the children of the first three primary grades and has barricaded Goffle Hill Road during the hours when -chool is receiving pupils and letting them out to prevent through traffic.

The buses have been maintained, even while young school children who attend the other four elementary schools have had to walk streets, like Lafayette, Lincoln, Dismond Bridge: which have heavy traffic or else he driven to school by their parents.

The burricades have been put up each school day despite a Motor Vehicle Department directive ordering them down and calling the blockades illegal and despite continual pleas from neighboring communities whose residents have had to travel miles out of their way to go to and from work.

Now eleven residents of the area across the street from Jefferson School are asking that the borough assume the cost of sidewalk assessment. The borough has already bent over backwards in soliciting state and county aid. having received enough to cover seventy-five per cent of

These residents didn't share the cost of sidewalk installation throughout our borough. Each individual property owner paid his share, as he was assessed.

The contention that the whole town will benefit from the sidewalks is a childish excuse. The whole town has benefitted from every sidewalk that was ever installed. The borough of Hawthorne isn't asking thirteen property owners to bend over backwards. 





Lincoln Continental

Reality out of a dream. That was the Lincoln Continental. Edsel Ford presented the sketches of his dream for an automobile to experts in the field of automotive design. The stylists found little to criticine. They did recommend, however, that the space tire be placed inside the trunk compariment - a practice generally favored at that time - but Edsel Ford insisted that it remain mounted outside the rear deck. Public opinion subsequently vindicated Edsel's choice; the Continental rear tire mount has become a mark of high style that is found on a number of latter day cars. It was this feature, along with the long hood, relatively short passenger compartment and rear deck treatment, that distinguished this car from others built in America. In the enthusiasm evoked by this styling concept, many lost sight of the fact that Edsel Ford originally intended that the Lincoln Continental be his personal car. With no thought of producing the car in quantity, he left for a Florida vacation and the first car was shipped to him there. He returned with some 200 orders for an automobile that was not even being made for public sale. Because each car had to be made virtually by hand, it was inevitable that it should cost more than a vehicle produced with conventional mass production techniques. Yet, the die was cast - Literally and figuratively. Although the cost ex ceeded that of typical production models, slightly modified Lincoln Zephyr parts were used in many areas. Special wood dies with metal surfaces eliminated the need for costlier steel dies, and aluminum castings, for example, were used for the windshield pillars. Only twenty-five Lincoln Continentals, all cabriolet convertibles, were produced in the first year, 1939,

In the years of actual production between 1939 and 1948, 5,322 units were made — 3,045 Continental coupes and 2,277 cabriolet convertibles. They soon became collector's items. Set on a 125-inch wheelbase, the Lincoln Continental was three inches lower and seven inches longer than most of it's standard contemporaries, and it's V-12 engine was polished like a jewel. The V-shape grille on the 1940-41 models was identeal to that of the Zephyr. The 1941 Continental, with parking lights atop the front fenders and flush-type button latches instead of the standard exterior door handles, was slightly different from its 1940 predecessor. It also had hydraulic window lifts and some changes in the chrome treatment. One contemporary publication said of the 1941 model: "Every line of this new cur, every move it makes, tells of far places, and ease of reaching them. The Lincoln-Continental is true to a great heritage. It blends Lincoln precision and care with Lincoln Zophyr leadership in design."

CLUB HISTORY

In February of 1961, a small group of young men, interested in automobiles met to form an auto club. At first the Club had to meet in various members homes until they received their first lucky break. The Club was loaned a garage by the first president's father, Mr. Alex Shovan. March, 1961, the Road Rebels Auto Club of Hawthorne was formed. The name of the Club was not accepted by many of the town's citizens. Thereafter the organization had very little recognition in the town. To gain the needed acceptance, the members purchased plaques and passed out courtesy eards to motorists that they assisted on the road, but to little

With the start of 1962, Harry Richardson was elected president, and the campaign for advancement went on. Courtesy cards were constantly being passed out, and letters of thanks were received by the Hawthorne Police Department, from the aided motorists. In the course of the year, the Club participated in manylund raising campaigns; the Cancer Prive, the Mother's March of Dimes, the Heart Pund.

and they raised money for a local needy family.

In the spring of 1962, the Club bought it's first car, a 1933 Chevrolet.

This started the Club's interest in antique cars. The Club also held a dance that year to raise money so they could continue to be an active part of the community. The dance was a financial set back and the morale of some of the members began to drop. At that time the Club was on the verge of collapse, but through hard work

and a lot of spirit, the members managed to stay together.

Good luck struck in 1963, when Mr. C. Macfarian of 452 Goffle Road authorized the use of a three-story, century old barn to the Club. Shortly after that, the structure was refinished and modernized to the present state. For the rest of 1963, the Club continued its fund raising campaigns and passed out more courtesy cards with more letters of recommendation being sent to the Police Department from grateful motorists. Another dance was held, this one an all around success. The membership grew as did the Club's knowledge of automobiles and by December, four cars were built and raced in competition at many of the sanctioned race tracks in the area.

1964 brought the Club full acceptance from the town of Hawthorne. At

this time the Club sponsored its first Antique and Classic Auto Show with great

success and satisfaction. Many of the town's noted people attended this show, some of these people were Congressman Charles Joelson, Mayor Bay of Hawthorne, Chief Charles Kenyon of Hawthorne, and our benefactress Mrs. C. Macfarlan.

1965 and 1966 found the Club expanding its work in the community and sponsored its second and third annual auto shows, both of which were great success.

In 1967, the Road Rebels Auto Club, after being an unofficial organization for more than six years, filed corporation papers with the State of New Jersey. During this year the Club sponsored a fourth auto show, dedicating the exhibition to the retiring Chief of Police of Hawthorne, Chief Charles F. Kenyon.

Financial problems befell the outfit during 1968, and prevented the staging of another auto show. But this year finds the Road Rebels Auto Club engaged in

the normal realm of engine swaping and rebuilding plus the planning of the Fifth Auto Show to be held in the town of Hawthorne.

After being together for more than eight and a half years, the members of the Road Rebels Auto Club, look toward the future in this a time of great and emitt change.






Nobody's Business-
