Post-War Armament Policies

Congressional investigations have a unique place in the American scheme. They provide "spot checks" for living inter-departmental and inter-agency "They ferret out facts on public issues. They enable the great body of citizens to become enlightened on matters where opin-

ion is divided. In brief, Congressional inquiries contribute much to the "trial and error" method of government under our Democratic system.

The real test of a committee investigation is the extent to which the experience gained is translated into programs and policies. A case in point is the current investigation of the production lag in the plants of the Brewster Aircraft Corporation. For weeks a House Naval Affairs sub-

committee has been delving into all the ramifications of Brewster. One phase of the hearings has dealt with the pre-war armament sales of the Miranda Brothers (A, J and I) and P. William Zolner.

Obviously, the subcommittee was seeking to ascertain what part, if any, the Mirandas and Zolner have had in the conduct of Brewster affairs. The testimony discloses that the only contact the Mirandas and Zolner had with Brewster was in their capacity as export agents, under an agreement which the Supreme Court of the State of New York found to be fair. They described frankly sales of armaments abroad, years prior to Pearl Harbor and with government approval. They revealed that not a single item had gone abroad until after it was turned down by the United States. The statements by the Mirandas and Zolner were not challenged, although their pre-war activities were under fire by implication.

In fact, at one point in the hearing the Mirandas questioned whether the production record at Brewster has become secondary to an investigative exploration of events that have not even the remotest connection with Brewster.

The findings of the subcommittee in pending time that makes possible production of implements of war. If the House subcommittee (or Brewster) buys the ground work for such a policy, inquiry will become a definite contribution to the war effort. The need for such a policy, from a long range viewpoint, transcends "show-horn" of armament makers in a clear-cut and open armament production at Brewster.

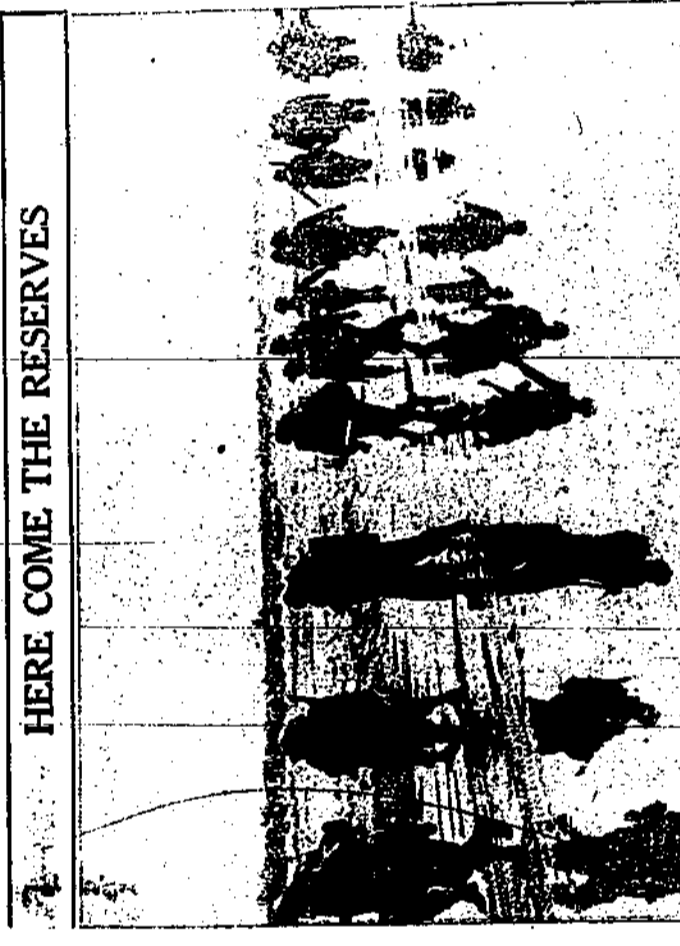
