

## Washington Ave. Sewer Project

In 1973 Municipal Budget

Hawthorne's 1973 municipal budget of \$2,180,417.31 includes appropriations for a Washington Avenue and Royal Avenue sewer project. At the Board of Commissioners meeting held February 7, notification was received from HUD in answer to an application made by the borough that Hawthorne would not receive federal funds.

Mayor Louis Bay II commented on the federal government statement that no new commitments would be issued; The decision is unfortunate after we waited so long to obtain federal funds approvements, which has not been broken down.

The defeat of the school budget current earnes as no surprise. The current excenses portion of \$15.5 million lost by 922 to 731. The margin was greater for \$136,550 in capital outlay with 1009 opposed and 676 in favor. #### A Washington's Birthday Gift

A Washington's Birthday gift is being presented to the country and i.s citizens, thanks to Union Camp Corporation, a major forest products firm based in Wayne, New Jersey. The gift in question is 49,000 acres of one of the last large wildland areas remaining in the East . . . the Great Dismal Swamp. George Wash ington once owned much of it. In all, the swamp covers about 250,000 acres in Virginia and North Carolina, but the Union Camp portion in Virginia is the largest segment under single ownership.

Union Camp's donation, with an appraised value of \$12.6 million,, is to The Nature Conservancy which in turn is conveying the land to the United States Department of Interior for operation as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System. The full transfer will take place over a three-year period and be completed by 1975, in time for the following year's national bi-centennial

Typical of the reaction to the gift is that of Gary A. Soucie, President of the Environmental Policy Center of Washington, D. C., who hailed it as "probably the greatest single act of corporate conservation philanthropy in the nation's history. Union Camp has set an example that will be to the lasting benefit of America." The company will, to a good degree, benefit from the tax as individuals to act in the public interest. But, this in no way diminishes the significance of the gift nor does it in any way decrease the praise Union Camp has earned with the singularly responsible act in the interest of the country and its citizens.
