



THE SCHOOL ROOM DISEASES

tagious diseases of children, the school room diseases, are most prevalent.

These diseases are caused by germs that can neither walk, run or fly. They must be carried if they are to spread these diseases. They may be carried in four ways: (1) by human excrement, (2) by discharges from the nose and mouth, (3) by contact, (4) by the bite of insects. The school room diseases are nearly all transmitted by the second means—discharges from the nose and mouth. Children are very careless with their saliva, sputum and masal discharges unless constantly watched and trained. They put all sorts of things in their mouths; they exchange partially eaten candies and fruits; they cough and sneeze without covering mouth or nose, thus spreading harmful germs from one to another. The school months are shut-in months, during which it is much harder to avoid contact with the infections of other folks. At school the children are in close contact with many other children, in whose homes there are sure to be




