Many disabled people now getting retirement payments, Fioresi pointed out, can qualify under this provision for a larger benefit amount as of July 1955. If the disabled person dies after June 30, 1955, the disability can protect his family's right to survivors payments, but only if he had applied for it before his death.

Active military service in the World War II and post-war periods and employment in the railroad industry may count toward the needed amount of work.

Although the law does not provide for the payment of cash social security retirement benefits before the worker reaches 65, it is nevertheless important that a disability is promptly with the Social Security Administration and establish the fact of his disability.
