## BOROUGH RESIDENTS ARE AGAIN ASKED; REPAIR SIDEWALKS

Borough residents were urged by Commissioner John G. Rozema to repair their sidewalks wherever necessary.

"A similar sidewalk repair program was instituted last year and my fellow commissioners and I were pleased with the overall cooperation of the townpeople," Rozema stated. "During the past winter, some damage has occurred to sidewalks in certain areas and we are asking these residents to cooperate as did those last year."

Rozema stated that repairs, in made, to sidewalks that have disintegrated, to those with large cracks and to walks that are raised above other sections.

"Sidewalks badly in need of repair could result in serious injury to pedestrians and also could cause their suits against property owners," Rozema stated. "Furthermore, disintegrated sidewalks could depreciate the value of your property and your neighbor's. This could lead to stum areas which, of course, no one wants in any community."

Rozema said a borough employee has started inspecting the sidewalks throughout the town. Notices will be sent to property owners whose sidewalks need repair and after a period of time, a second inspection will be made.

If repairs are not made by the time the second inspection is conducted, then the borough will do the work and the property owner will be assessed, Rozema stated. "I earnestly hope that the borough will not have to go to the expense of repairing sidewalks," Rozema stated. "The cooperation of everyone will continue to make this the borough of homes of which we are proud."

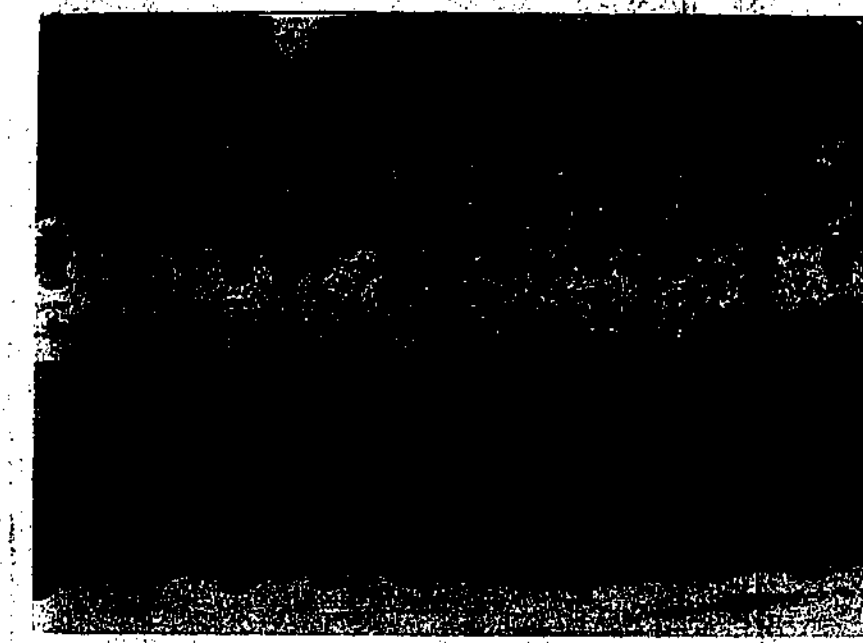

The case of the railroad "against featherbedding" is clear-cut. Modern work rules to eliminate work that is not needed and prevent work that is not performed have been endorsed by two Presidential commissions and by the courts—up to and including the Supreme Court.

But still, in four years of fighting and maneuvering and ducking, the on-train unions have refused to consider, discuss or negotiate meaningful work-rule changes or to submit the issue to arbitration. And in the "eleventh hour" of the crisis period requested by President Kennedy for "one last effort" to resolve the rail crisis, they have rejected the proposals of Labor Secretary Wirtz.

Thus, on July 3, Chairman J. E. Wolfe of management's National Railway Labor Conference announced the "complete breakdown" of this final effort at negotiation. He said: "Since every Presidential commission and by the courts—up to and including the Supreme Court."

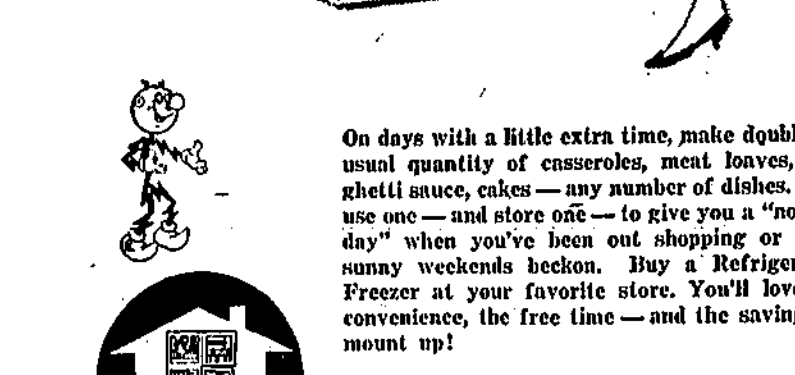

PLEASE FOR 456 MILLION MORE IN DEPRESSION AREA AID

This Should Be Stopped

The revival by the Senate of the bill to provide an additional \$456 million for aid to so-called depressed areas is to be stopped.

That's because the depressed area program has been wasteful and ineffective and there is not the slightest reason to believe that it will fare any better simply because there will be more money to spend. If it was a mistake to start the program, it will be an even bigger mistake to increase its expenditures.

It is to be hoped, therefore, that the members of the House who deflected the bill by a vote of 209 to 204 will stand staunchly to the occasion when it is reconsidered and once again reject the bid for bonanza-giving funds.

The Congressmen and Senators who have opposed this new attempt by the Administration to buy itself into prosperity—despite all its failures in that direction—are deserving of the highest commendation.

They are against the measure because they know that the positive way to reduce unemployment is through the creation of the jobs that only an expanding, dynamic economy can provide.

Economic expansion requires an adequate supply of private capital and this can best be brought about through reform of the income tax rates which now appropriate the savings of individuals and businesses that otherwise would provide the investment funds vital to faster economic growth. And the legislation which would make this possible is right at hand in the form of the Herlong-Baker tax rate reform bills.

Rejection of the depressed area bill and passage of the Herlong-Baker legislation would comprise a "double-play" of immeasurable and lasting benefit to the national economy and to all Americans.

Dark glasses are no protection. Telescopes and binoculars magnify and intensify the rays. The suggested safe method of viewing the eclipse is by standing with your back to the sun and watching the image of the eclipse as it falls on a light or white surface.

The burning power of the sun's rays can burn and destroy the sensitive retina of the eye. Those rays are brought to focus on the retina by the optical system within the eye.

Don't let the eclipse of the sun produce a tragic eclipse of your vision. Don't look directly at it.

lead article in the July issue of "The Reader's Digest," which is composed from an address Mr. Farley made before the Executive Club of Chicago, presents his view in an effort to remind his countrymen... of the stuff they are made of.

He states his thesis in his opening paragraph: "Sixty and thirty the Klondike's propaganda is directed toward breaking the will of the American people to resist. This is certainly true. But there is a vast difference between taking care and taking to the woods."

Mr. Farley calls on history to supply us with the evidence of what other Americans, most of them long dead, did in times of grave and commensurate danger. The roll is a long one, going as far back as the story of the pioneers who made this nation what it is today. "Give me liberty or give me death," in Mr. Farley's phrase, "is the motto of the American who must be prepared to fall for us."

Mr. Farley denies that, as the world conquest, as he points out, Russia herself supports this idea. We saved Russia from Soviet occupation when she was reeling on the edge of total collapse. We asked nothing in return. And when, because of our monopoly of atomic weapons our military

superiority was overwhelming, we did for world disarmament, it was the Soviets who closed the door. It is an ungrateful act, we spent \$60 billion of our treasure to aid other nations of the world.

Ungrateful editorial writing is as old as journalism. Long may it abide.

## ...Editorial...

### A Local Problem

A common response to the statement that the cost of government should be reduced in nonessential, non-defense areas is: "Where would you make the cut?"

Well, many an excellent survey has pointed to various places where cuts of assorted sizes, many substantial, are not only possible but desirable. For instance, take this excerpt from an editorial in the Chicago, Illinois, Leader-Examiner: "REA was organized during the 1930's to bring electricity to the nation's farms. It did 1930's to today, though, 98 per cent of the nation's farms are electrified, and you'd think that this would be one Federal department that had about worked itself out of a job. Unfortunately, this almost never happens. As Fortune magazine points out in its article, 'There's No Stopping REA—Or Is There?', the 'top cop' financed by REA have grown into a nationwide, 64 billion electric group increasingly engaged in aggressive, government-subsidized competition with investor-owned electric companies. Five out of six of the country's new member companies in recent years have been in industrial, commercial, and non-farm residential customers."

This, of course, is a national problem. But, beyond that, it is a local problem too, which affects in one way or another every community in the land. All of us are taxpayers—and all of us lose when government enters business on a subsidized basis—or when a heavily-taxed private business is prevented from expanding and doing the job of which it is capable.

Let REA and its crops have all due credit for what they have done. But the goal has been reached and it's time to call a halt.

COUNTIES SPEND MORE ON CAPITAL PROJECTS

New Jersey's 21 counties spent more than \$22 million on capital improvements last year. That's a record for the State since 1952. During the preceding 1957-61 period, the counties spent an overall average of \$19.5 million on capital improvements. These improvements include such things as buildings, land, highways, bridges, machinery and equipment. Planned from both current and borrowed funds, they are financed separately from "operating cost" and debt service expenditures in the County.

Passaic County spent \$1,397,624 on capital improvements last year. This compared with an outlay of \$1,467,386 in 1961 and a five-year (1957-61) average annual outlay of \$89,887 in the County.

## SPORTS AFIELD

Millions of Americans diligently save their money to buy a boat. Then, when they have bought the boat, they decide that their next move is to buy a waterfront lot on which to build a cabin or pitch a tent.

The nature and location of the lot you purchase should be selected with your boat in mind, says Wilford Crandall, Staff Editor of Sports Afield Magazine. There should be protection if the boat is left in the water, or it should be possible to take it in and out with a minimum of difficulty.

The property you buy should not be so low that the waterfront is soft or swampy. It should not be too high, either. Steep banks create a problem when taking the boat in and out of the water—it can't be done by trailer. Then, too, climbing a hill after tying up the boat—or even just pulling down to launch it—tends to restrict its use. Hill climbing also makes looking after the boat a chore. Everyone likes to putter with his own boat, even if he avoids safe upkeep and repair work—but climbing a hill takes the fun out of it.

Purchasing property with too high an elevation is a common mistake. It must be guarded against, for the condition grows worse with passing time—fishermen grow old, as other people do. Nearly all purchases of vacation property are made on a long-term basis. Often, in the summer, I see kids swimming and cavorting at beaches their grandparents enjoyed many years ago.

back. Here's another point: quick dropoffs and deep water right at shore are often characteristic of high-elevation property. This not only presents swimming problems, but may also make family boating hazardous because climbing in and out of a small boat, and beaching it just can't be done.

Waves can be hard on boats kept at pier. In bathhouses or on the beach, waves can bang, rub and wear boats; they can make launching and landing difficult and dangerous. Unless your boat can be tied up in a small, sheltered cove, it should not face the direction of the prevailing winds. In most parts of this country the prevailing winds come from the west, making the east shore of any waterway the most desirable.

Northern exposure is not considered good either, because of cold cross-water winds. Then, too, there's not much chance of a lake breeze in hot weather. My own lakeside home has a southeast exposure, usually considered the ideal compromise.

## OUTDOOR TIPS

MYSTERY BUOY

Capitally soft water fishermen know this tip. It's a way to mark a place you don't want anyone to find. Simply soak a wooden buoy in salt brine for several days. Then attach it to its anchor and anchor line. Thrown over the side, buoy, rope and anchor sink. BUT salt leeching out of wood restores wood's natural buoyancy and in a week or so, pop goes the buoy right to the surface.

LOOY MAI NO BLASTERS

Lumbermen in the north don't hole in their ax handles. Fill it with olive oil and plug hole. Oil runs through handle, prevents dry hands, preserves the woods and sets as a natural lubricant helping keep blisters off the hands of city fellers who might want to use their ax.

EXTINGUISHY SNOWSHOES

Ever need a pair of snowshoes? If you do, evergreen boughs lashed into a flat shape will do the job well enough so you can move across deep snow.

GAME GARDEN

The large pine hardware stores sell to hang shower curtains on make good game carriers if you slip them through your belt. Animal's head slips through big end, neck jams down into small end. SINK! YOP! \$88!! \*X

Do you have trouble with your landing net drying out between catches so the Gel Durn thing flexes when you try to slip it under fish. Stop this in a jiffy by dipping the net in melted paraffin before you go out. Will sink like a rock.

SCREW LOOSE

If a particular screw on a reel or rifle or shotgun keeps coming loose, fix it right by putting a drop of shellac on the threads before seating it securely.

TWO SOCKS

Keep old wool socks for at least three purposes: slip them on over boots to move quietly through the woods on dry-leaf days. Sew and into crude but effective throw-away mittens for ice fishing.

COPPER CAN

UTTERBOARDS LAMP

Met the boss of a plumber's candle and seat it well back in a coffee can turned on its side. Punch a hole in the top of can and hang it in tent or around camp. Gluck of can reflects and intensifies light, depth of can keeps vapors from blowing candle out.

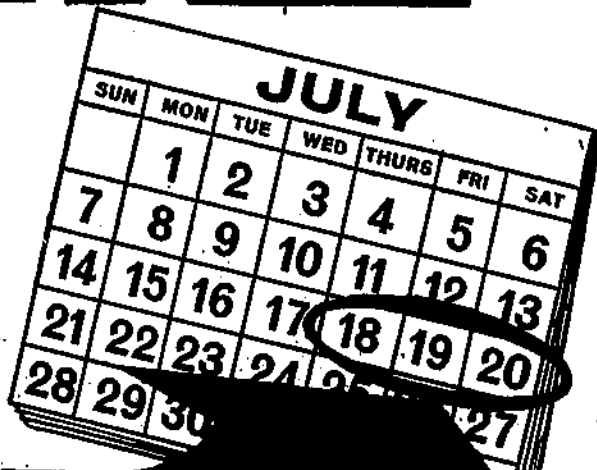
