Health Services in the Colleges

better knowledge for how to care
for their bodies than was available to physicians of fifty years
ago. How a modern college educates its students for healthy living is described by Dr. Joseph E. Raycroft, Chairman Department of

Health Education Service Was Tuberculosis League to the County of Passaic County Tuberculosis and Health Association.

The need for health service was recognized and its remedy suggested by the wise president of a New England College back in the 50's of last century. He saw that too many students were forced by ill health to drop out of college or suffered from physical handicaps after they were graduated.
