Tax Stamps Must be Affixed to Inside of Windshield

A new regulation requiring that Federal use tax stamps be affixed to the inside of automobile windshields, at or near the center of the windshield, was announced today by Arthur W. MacLean, State vehicle commissioner.

The regulation, which becomes effective on the first day of the second stamp issue, for which July 1 is the deadline for motor vehicle owners to purchase stamps, states that the stamps must be affixed to the inside of the windshield.

The "new regulation results from the fact that the new use tax stamps have a different design and are more difficult to enter information on the card," MacLean said. "Previously, the stamps were affixed to the outside of the windshield, but this was not satisfactory."

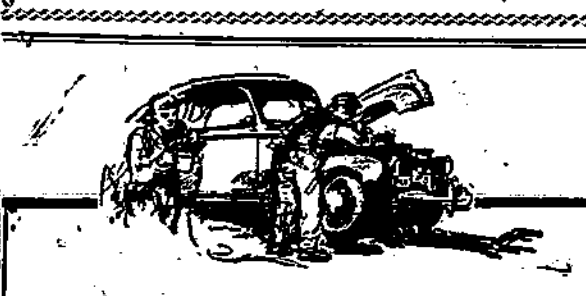

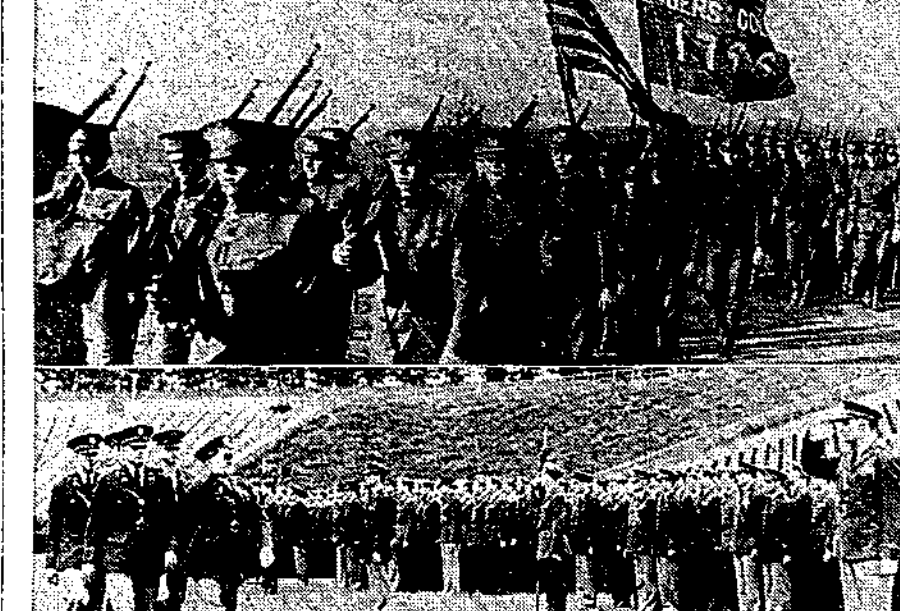

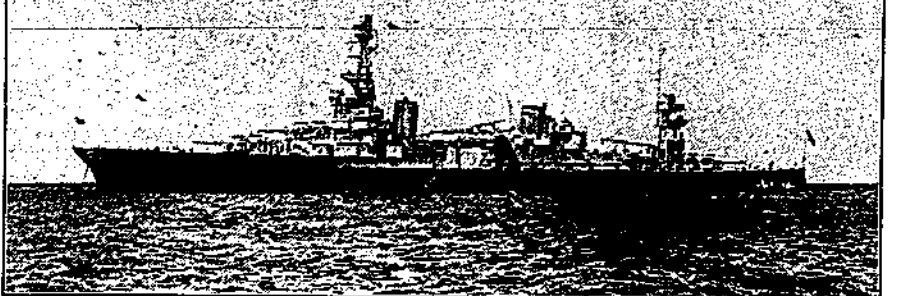
In the United States, a dozen years ago there was only one great union—the American Federation of Labor, now led by William Green. When John L. Lewis became the head of the United Mine Workers, he raised the issue of "industrial unionism" versus "A.F. of L. craft." Lewis opposed the NLRB, which insisted that the financial support of the industry be maintained. In recent years CIO has gathered in a total membership that put it in the same class with the A.F. of L. The two organizations seemed to hate each other. Finally, after the last Presidential election John L. Lewis voluntarily resigned as president of the CIO, devoted his talents to United Mine Workers and succeeded in leading his entire coal-mining membership into a "closed shop" with full Government recognition. Philip Murray succeeded Lewis as President of CIO.

Lewis had grown to regard himself as a sort of a patriarch-union-boss, and he may have had the best of intentions when he addressed President Green and suggested that they get together, kiss and make up. Both men were sincere in their intentions, and when President Roosevelt agreed with them that Lewis was taking out of turn, the point of A.F. of L. started shooting at Lewis' fortress.
