Millions of Americans will be shopping for a power lawn mower for the first time this year and their most common question will be, "What type should I buy—reel or rotary?"

Dr. James Tyson, director of Soils Science at Michigan State College, conducted extensive experiments on this question and found that the reel-type mower, which has a scissors action, is best for lawns where appearance is the most important factor.

On lawns or fields which contain tall weeds and tough grasses, the rotary mower, which cuts with a free spinning, high speed blade, is recommended.


