In this series, we will tell you about many of the more common insects but reinember, in general, that there are two ways to control them: By a contact spray that poisons them from the outside when it hits them—for example, Black Leaf 40 is so used—or by a stomach poison which the insects eat and which kills by its internal effects. In the latter case, lead arsenate is the standby. Sucking insects cannot be poisoned by internal treatment and some of our most destructive pests, such as aphis, are suckers.

For example, while the grown asparagus beelle can be killed by covering the grown plants with a spray made of a pound of lead arsenate, one pound of soap and fifteen gallons of water, yet this spray is dangerous to humans when sprayed on the tips that are to be eaten, and so the tiny worms should be attacked as fast as they fast by also spraying the delible tips with Black Leaf 40, using a teaspoonful in a quart of soapy water.
