PROMOTED TO MAJOR

Capt. Edward T. McBride of Hawthorne, has been promoted to Major in the Ordnance Department as of May 11, and ordered to continue the development of plastic combat components in the office of the Chief of Ordnance, Washington, D. C.

Over 20 plastic parts have been standardized by the Ordnance Department for issue to tank forces in the Arctic and the tropics. These components were tested at temperatures ranging from 40 degrees below zero to 170 degrees above, before issue to troops.

Major McBride recently told the Ordnance Department, Major McBride, a fellow of the American Institute of Chemists, is on the plastics and paint committee of the American Society for Testing Materials and the Federal executive specification groups. He is the vice-chairman of the organic plastics section of the Federal executive specification committee.

Prior to his service with the Ordnance Department, Major McBride was a research chemist for the Bakelite Corporation, and a First Lieutenant in the 312th Infantry.

Major McBride was appointed Second Lieutenant of Infantry Officers Reserve Corps in December, 1934 and was assigned to the 812th Infantry. His promotion to First Lieutenant followed four years later. When ordered to extended active duty, as a First Lieutenant, he was in command of Company M (Heavy Weapons) and instructor in the Third Military Area Gas Officers School. He was made a Captain as of Feb. 1, 1942. His home address was 116 Tuxedo avenue, Hawthorne.

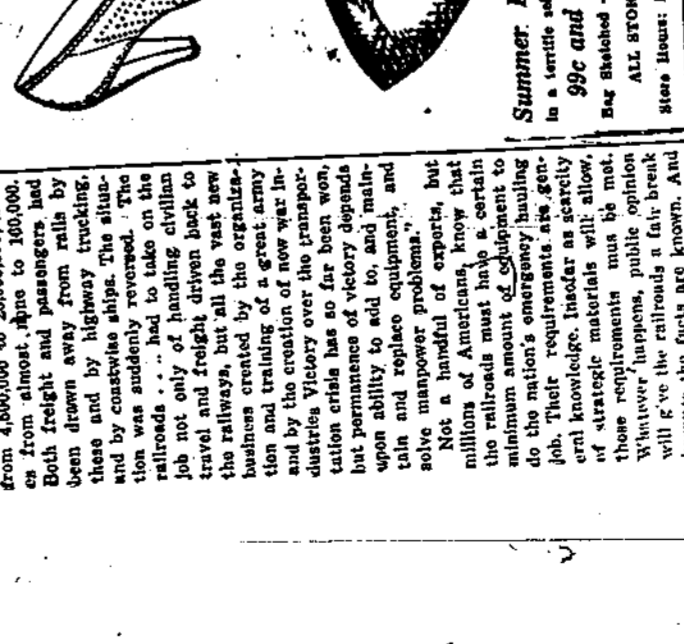
