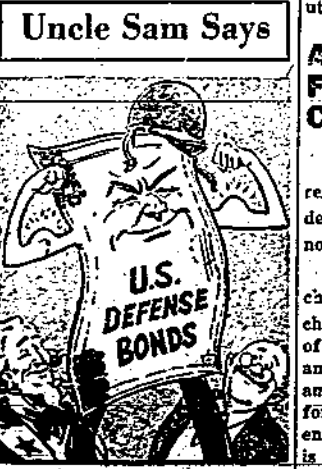

# Turnpike Safety Record Much Better Than On Public Highways

TRENTON, N. J.—In spite of inclement weather conditions early in March, including snow and ice, the safety record on the New Jersey Turnpike for all of that month was much better than that expected on public highway systems, it was announced today by the New Jersey Turnpike Authority.

During March there were a total of 51 accidents recorded on the Turnpike, which, using the standard formula of the federal and State governments in reporting accidents, averaged 55 per 100 million miles of vehicular travel. The March figures for the State are not available but the latest figures covering the first ten months of 1951 showed, by comparison, 281 accidents per 100 million miles of travel on the State's public highways.

For the first three months of 1952, accidents on the Turnpike totaled 223 which, on the standard basis, were equal to 172 per 100 million miles of travel. The Turnpike's 51 accidents in March, 21 involved damage to property, 29 injury to persons and one was a fatal accident. Twenty-eight of the accidents occurred in darkness and 22 in daylight.

On the whole, the accidents on the Turnpike in the first quarter were the result of human factors including such causes as following too closely, excessive speed, improper passing, lane changes, and failure to yield. The Turnpike had five fatalities in the first three months, equal to 3.7 per 100 million miles, as against 5.8 for the State highway system in the first ten months of 1951.

Several of the neighborhood groups are being organized and the campaign is being carried on a large scale.

The State Department of Health gives priority in the use of its case-finding equipment to those areas in which tuberculosis is most prevalent. It does so on the basis of cases of tuberculosis and deaths from tuberculosis reported to the Department. This policy of "selective mass x-ray screening" has produced a significant increase in positive referrals (persons whose x-rays indicate suspected tuberculosis). In other words, more potential tuberculosis patients are being found per dollar expended.
