And yet this ought to be the optimum period for effective rehabilitation. Down through history there has been vastly greater emphasis on the vengeful aspect of punishment than there has been on the possibility of helping a man discover aptitudes which can make him a contributing member of society.

Because of the age-old instinct to seek punitive redress, we have closed our eyes to the enormous potential represented by the time span involved in any given sencan, theoretically, be devoted to more thoughtful analysis of a prisoner's needs and talents and channeling them into useful ends.
