Special Course For Businessmen On Emergency Government Controls Offered By Stevens Institute Center

The first in a series of short courses for business men to be offered as a public service by the Management Center of Stevens Institute of Technology, will be given this fall, Robert H. Baker, director of the Graduate School, announced today. Entitled "Emergency Government Controls and Government Contracts," the course is designed to give business men first-hand information on how government regulations affect their operations. It will also cover the principal special requirements for government contracts.

The course will include discussion on the government agencies with which business men must deal, control of materials, price and wage controls, and government procurement—particularly defense business.

A number of the chiefs of the most interested government agencies and their staff experts have agreed to come and discuss their special fields and answer questions submitted by students. Members of the Stevens Institute School faculty will serve as instructors.

There has been an increasing demand by many of the smaller manufacturing enterprises in Northern New Jersey for special facilities to assist them in meeting the difficulties of today's constantly changing development. Stevens has attempted all along to adjust its offerings to these special needs. It was explained by Ernest H. Weinbaum, associate professor of industrial management in the Graduate School, that the course will be given on Monday evenings in eight sessions beginning on October 8. Certification of attendance will be awarded to those completing the course.

Article from this special course, the Graduate School at Stevens will offer two others, in the regular curriculum, for business men. They are Small Business Management and Planning Small Business. Formal educational requirements will be waived for those with broad practical experience who will be admitted as special students on a non-credit basis.

KNOW YOUR GOVERNMENT

Tax exemptions continue to increase. This is indicated by data compiled by the New Jersey Taxpayers' Association for use in its annual publication, "Financial Statistics of New Jersey Municipalities," to be released in September.

Exempt property in New Jersey this year is valued at \$1,435,761,861, or nearly one and one-half billion dollars. This represents an increase of almost 28 million dollars over 1950.

Overall, exemptions form almost 19 per cent of the total property value for assessment purposes in New Jersey.

County-wide, the percentage of

exempt property to total valuation ranges from 23.1 per cent in Middlesex County to 6.4 per cent in Salem County.

More than 181 million dollars in taxable property valuations were added to the tax rolls of municipalities throughout the State this year. Total net valuations taxable rose from \$5,544,485,870 last year to \$6,125,500,880 in 1951.

Real property exempted from taxation, with certain exceptions, shortly will be subject to a check by municipal assessors. In line with provisions of an act of the 1951 State Legislature, the State Treasurer currently is distributing forms to be used by local

assessors in obtaining statements from owners showing their estimated right to enjoy tax exemption status. Personal property and vehicles are not subject to taxation. Exemptions are not subject to the check which is to be made annually prior to October 1, each year under laws of the newly enacted Sales Act.
