FATHERHOOD IS NO LONGER REASON FOR DRAFT DEFERMENT

Colonel D. A. MacGrath, New Jersey Director of Selective Service, said today that fathers before the war who were deferred from military service because of fatherhood, as such, will no longer be granted deferment, but beginning Tuesday.

Motorists Make Their Own Rules Says AANJ Head

There are 50 million New Jersey drivers and the majority of them are making their own rules of the road, which is in all probability a contributing factor in the recording of the traffic toll. Last year in New Jersey there were 827 killed and 38,000 injured, states William Green, President of the Motor Club of America (Automobile Association of New Jersey).

"On the open road in New Jersey, we have a 50 mile per hour speed limit, but a check on any one of our highways reveals cars traveling at 60 mph. Why? Usually the drivers have determined for themselves that 60 miles per hour is not too fast. Observe a stop sign... any stop sign stands there and watch the drivers ignore it."

A. Yes. So long as you can present evidence to the VA that you
